February 9 2016 Weeks Ringle

Luminous Quilts

Creating quilts with luminosity is a challenge to even the most experienced quiltmaker. This lecture will explore the concepts of contrast, value and color relationships.



Weeks Ringle and Bill Kerr are professional quiltmakers and co-founders of Modern Quilt Studio, a design studio in Oak Park, Illinois. Since 1999 Bill and Weeks have brought a modern twist to the great American quilting tradition with decades of quiltmaking experience and graduate design degrees.

Modern Quilt Studio launched the first ever magazine exclusively dedicated to modern quilting, Modern Quilts Illustrated, in 2011. Their books on modern quilting and design include Transparency Quilts, Quilts Made Modern, The Modern Quilt Workshop and Quiltmaker's Color Workshop.

Their work has been featured widely in the national press including in O:The Oprah Magazine, TIME, The New York Times, Dwell, American Patchwork & Quilting and Country Living. They design multiple lines a year for Andover Fabrics and have developed bedding and textiles for Crate and Barrel.

Bill and Weeks lecture and teach design and quiltmaking throughout the US and internationally. When not busy designing and sewing, Weeks writes about craft and creativity on her blog Craft Nectar.

WORKSHOP: "Rediscovering Your Stash" February 10, 2016

Time: 9:30 – 4 pm Location: Thimbles, Lockport Level: Adventurous beginning To advanced

Non-members that come to the lecture will be let into the guild meeting for **FREE** <u>if</u> they signed up for the workshop.

Gain color confidence and plan creative ways to use your stash in one day! Mix a big dose of color theory with an in-depth discussion of combining patterns and a pinch of working with large-scale fabrics and you'll end up with a plan for projects that you want to make from the fabrics you already have. In addition, you'll have consultations about how to freshen up your stash while learning how to use fabrics that you love but find perplexing. You'll see new possibilities for working with your stash and leave the workshop with beautiful palettes and plans for your next few projects. Bring patterns you love and fabrics you'd like to use or are unsure how to use and you'll be amazed at how you'll be able to pull it all together.

An open mind and a large assortment of cotton quilting fabric. Try to include different values and hues, small-scale prints, tone-on-tone prints, solids, stripes, batiks, large-scale fabrics and especially fabrics you love but find challenging to use. Small quantities are fine. You'll also need a sewing machine, rotary cutting equipment, extension cord, thread, seam ripper, notebook or journal, and any supplies you like to have handy when quilting. Our **Fabric Fusion** quilt, shown above, is just one example of a quilt that students have made using their stashes and what they have learned in this workshop.

Philanthropy Sew-In April 12 Sandy Hess and Joanne Sheahan rggphilanthropy@gmail.com

Happy February, the month of love! Let's show how much love our Guild has for others and remember to take some time for quilting for those in need.

Our sew-in will be here before we know it. There are a few changes this year. NOTHING hard! It's time to begin the process.

Here are our guidelines for 2016

1. We will use **only cotton fabric** this year. <u>NO FLANNEL</u>. It is soft and cuddly but caused a lot of problems while preparing them for delivery. We will not accept any flannel for the sew-in. If you are making and completing one at home, it must be washed and brushed, to remove the lint before we will accept it.

2. Begin by cutting (2) each 8" squares of cotton fabric. Using the same fabric for the front and back of sandwich is preferred.

3. Cut (1) 7" square of batting. You may mix and match batting.

4. Assemble the sandwich. 8" square on top, batting in middle, 8" square on back – just like a regular quilt but really small!

5. Keeping all sides matching, sew from corner to corner forming a big X.

6. Square is finished – have some chocolate!

If you are completing a rag quilt at home, use 49 squares. 7 squares across and 7 rows up and down and a $\frac{1}{2}$ inch seam to join the squares and also to connect the rows. Please check your seams because it is easy for a square to slip and then it comes apart.

Pat Sloan designer, author, lecturer, and with her weekly radio show... Pat truly is the "Voice of Quilting". She has a deep passion for making quilting fun for herself and everyone around her. Pat loves to hang out with quilters on the internet as well as visit you in person. Be inspired to get more done!

Sewing since she was a child and guilting for over 20 years, Pat eventually looked to her craft as a business. After a few years guilting she started to teach guilt making to others and then turned her skills to pattern designing. She found that she really enjoys designing and seeing how other guilters made her patterns. In 2000 Pat's designs became so popular that she and her husband Gregg formed a design and publishing company called Pat Sloan & Co. In addition to designing and publishing her work, they now travel around the country teaching and showing her guilts to guilt guilds and guilt shops. Also, Pat has had her designs published in all the national magazines, she has written 31 quilt books and has designed many lines of fabric for Moda Fabrics.

When Pat took her passion to the internet she built several quilt communities, the largest is her group on Facebook with over 41,000 quilters from around the world.
