Kathleen Tracy is a quilt pattern designer and author who sewed her first small quilt in 2000. Making quilts for her daughter's American Girl dolls sparked an interest in history and led to the publication *American Doll Quilts* in 2004. Kathleen is inspired by antique quilts in making her small scrappy quilts from simple blocks. She hopes that her books make the past come alive and give quilters a connection with quilters from long ago. Kathleen is also the author of *Prairie Children & Their Quilts, Remembering Adelia and The Civil* War Sewing *Circle.* A new book on small quilts will be published in December.

Kathleen lives in the Chicago area and lectures at quilt guilds in the U.S. She also conducts workshops on small antique-style quilts. She is an avid reader and loves gardening, cooking and making simple beaded jewelry. # September 13, 2016 Jane Sassaman

Lecture: Jane's Textile Treasure Garden"

After a varied career in the design world, Jane began to quilt in 1980. She found that these "soft paintings" satisfied the draftsman, the craftsman and the artist in her. She is now a dedicated (some say "obsessed") quilt artist and fabric designer.

Jane's art quilts have been shown in many national and international exhibits including Quilt National 1989-2005 and Contemporary American Quilts, the first major exhibit of American art quilts in England. Her quilt "Willow" was named as One of the One Hundred Best American Quilts of the Century. Jane is also the author of *The Quilted Garden* which includes twenty years of her work and exercises for making nature-inspired quilts.

Jane's love for historic decorative arts is especially evident in the exuberant fabric she is designing for Free Spirit. Her designs are oversized and colorful and have been coined as "William Morris on anti-depressants." They are created for quilts, wearables and home decorating. Her latest book, *Patchwork Sassaman Style*, beautifully illustrates her fabric "in action."


