Char's love of sewing goes back to her childhood where she was encouraged to sew by her aunt, mother, and older sisters. Being the youngest of 5 girls, she began sewing all of her own clothes at the age of 12. She later studied Fashion Design and did custom dressmaking and alterations.



She learned the "It's OK if You Sit on my Quilt" method of quilting in the 1980s and soon began teaching quilting. At the same time her fascination with reproducing antique quilts turned into pattern designing when other


