
We need some cold weather blankets for Hesed House and always have a need for the Care Center so Keep Up the Good Work!

Quilting Designs by Joanie Zeier Poole of
Sun Prairie, Wisconsin. This workshop is for all
quilters! So if you hand quilt, or quilt on a
domestic or longarm machine you will learn
how to adapt quilting motifs to fit a variety of
spaces, and how to choose motifs that will
enhance the background space you are filling,
and / or make your piecing come to life.

November 22 **Background Bonanza** by Joanie Zeier Poole. Create a whole cloth sampler of patterns used to anchor and entire quilt top or just fill in around stitched motifs. Enjoy a full and creative day expanding your free-motion skills creating a wholecloth sampler. You will go home with an impressive portfolio of stitched examples of the techniques taught.

Char Hopeman

December 9 Guild Meeting

Char Hopeman is a wife and mother of two girls ages 33 and 25 both married. She has lived in the Glen Ellyn/Wheaton area all of her life. Char's love of sewing goes back to her childhood where she was encouraged to sew by her aunt, mother, and older sisters. Being the youngest of 5 girls, she began sewing all of her own clothes at the age of 12. She later studied Fashion Design and did custom dressmaking and alterations.



She learned the "It's OK if You Sit on my Quilt" method of quilting in the 1980s and quilting soon replaced garment sewing. She soon began teaching quilting in her home. At the same time her fascination with reproducing antique quilts turned into pattern designing when other quilters asked if there were patterns for her quilts.

She opened a retail quilt shop in 2000 and there she honed her skills in business and merchandising. Later she closed her store and began longarm quilting and designing patterns for a local fabric company and began designing fabric in 2010.

In 2012, she designed the "ZIG-ZAG" ruler. By the urging of a quilting-teacher friend, she took her rulers and ZIG-ZAG patterns to the wholesale market in Houston. They were a huge success and then her

focus became concentrated on ZIG-ZAG.
