What a wonderful month August has been for kindness and generosity from our guild.

At the guild bee we collected from Jean Hilderbrand, 2 twin size tops; from Myra Harcourt, 3 quilts; from Roberta Hollonbeck, 1 quilt; Oriene Springstroh, 1 lap quilt.

At the bee, Sandy Alfaia completed a pillowcase and donated it while Janelle Black brought 14 heart pillows and 20 port pillows that were all stuffed and sewn during the bee. What fun!

A special thanks to the Sew and Tells bee for sorting by color all the fabric for the give away at the meeting. Isn't free material great!

We delivered 7 pillow cases, 14 heart pillows, and 20 port pillows to Edward's Cancer Center.

The story we want to share comes from our visit to Edward's Care Center. We met with Melissa who gave us permission to use a photo of the room where sexually abused children are examined. She wanted us to see and share how important our quilt and pillowcase donations are. I'm sharing this through our newsletter because

when I describe the scene, I tend to cry.

Although the room has pictures for children, it is a cold and sterile exam room with a little white bed, sitting between instrument trays and hanging IV bags. When you think of a little girl or boy facing the exam it breaks your heart.

Melissa took us into the room and asked us to wait while she transformed it. She returned with a quilt and pillowcase and made the bed up with them. The difference is amazing. She told us that when a child sees the bright and pretty bed it helps them relax a bit.

Along with quilts and pillow cases, there is a donor who makes the teddy bears and another who makes the necklaces. When put together, this terrifying room transforms into a room where attention is on the pretty bed and not the necessary surroundings. The staff have a very tough job to do and if our donations help this much how can we not keep making our quilts and pillowcases. They need them very much.

We delivered 5 guilts and you may notice the one in the picture is one of ours.

As for size for the Care Center, they will take the really small and send them to other units but lap size or larger are really needed. Estimate: 48" wide or larger. This is just an estimate so don't agonize too much! Bright colors are good. Just use your judgment and remember the average age is 6 to teenage.

Pillowcases: Children's patterns are really needed and we can use the adult patterns at Hesed House and Edward's Cancer Center.

Year to date deliveries: 14 quilts, 14 pillowcases, 14 heart pillows and 27 port pillows. Wonderful work ladies!

# Salt Creek Quilt Guild Thangles Workshop

The Salt Creek Quilt Guild would like to invite you to attend one of their events featuring Sara Hochhauser who will be speaking and teaching about Thangles. Thangles triangle paper helps you make half square triangles really fast and accurately. The guild's meeting is at 7:00 pm on September 11<sup>th</sup> at the Hinsdale Community House, 415 W. Eighth St. in Hinsdale.

There will be two separate workshops. The first workshop is on Friday, September 12<sup>th</sup> where Sara will be teaching how to make a Christmas tree skirt or table topper. The second



workshop is on Saturday, September 13<sup>th</sup> where she will be teaching how to make a Tree of Life Quilt block.



A \$6.00 fee for a Thangle pack is required for each workshop. Each package of Thangles makes several hundred half square triangles. Both of these workshops are great for all levels of quilters. The fee for a 6 hour workshop for non-members is \$50.

Workshops are held at Grace Lutheran Church, 4101 Wolf Road in Western Springs from 9am until 4pm. You can bring your own lunch or orders are taken for sandwiches from a local deli for \$7.00.




