Since then I have designed and published multiple strip patterns and books. I have also designed a ruler called the Stripology ruler which makes stripping so much easier, accurate and efficient. This lecture will take you through my strip collecting process, how I choose strips for my quilts, color combination and choices in scrappy quilts and how to choose background fabrics and accents to pull your scrappy goodness together. I will take you through the thought process behind the Stripology ruler and of course show you multiple strip quilts along the way."

Machine Piecing

Carol Doak Teaches You to Paper Piece - She's the master of Foundation Piecing

Sally Collins Teaches you Precision Piecing - The master at Precision - Lots of help making your piecing more accurate. This video is no longer available and is a real treasure.

Grand Finale, Ricky Tims - even if you get nothing else from this video, he shows how to bring up your bobbin thread at the end of machine quilting. It's a useful technique. But there's a ton more techniques from beginning a quilt to binding, including a special binding.

Crazy About Curves, Vikki Pignatelli. No measuring, no 1/4" seams, for piecing curves, whole cloth facing, make your own pattern or use the one included.
